Plant type: Evergreen perennial (reseeds)
Season of Interest: Late spring to summer
Height: 12-18" **Spread:** 12-15"
Water needs: Low
Native Region: CO, AZ, KS, NE, NM, OK, TX, UT, WY
Elevation: to 13,200'
Important to know: Great "landing pads" for all pollinator types. Aggressive rhizomatous spreader in moist soils. Can be mown.



Maintenance: Low
Characteristics: Showy, cut flowers
Garden Uses: Beds/borders
Habitat: Rock garden, prairie and meadow

Ease of Propagation: Easy

Propagation: Dry store the seeds at 70°F over the winter. Sow, cover very lightly. Expose to 70-77°F in the day and 60°F at night. These temperatures are goals. A warm daytime temperature is the most important one.
