Golden Columbine



Plant type:	Perennial
Season of Interest:	Late spring to frost
Height: 30-36"	Spread: 16-20"
Water needs:	Moderate to moist
Native Region:	CO, AZ, NM, TX, UT
Elevation:	to 9,000'
Important to know:	Remove spent flowers in late June to encourage longer blooming. Best planted in masses as they can smother smaller plants.



Maintenance:	Low
Characteristics:	Cut flowers, showy
Garden Uses:	Beds/borders
Habitat:	Foothills, moist gulches & ravines, near waterfalls

Ease of Propagation: Easy

Propagation: Cold stratification is not necessary. Sow in May. Cover very lightly. Can be sown in situ in late fall or in spring (March-April). (Sherry Fuller, Gardens on Spring Creek.)
