Propagation: Seeds require light to germinate. Store seeds dry at 40°F for 5-6 months then sow with very light cover, germinates at 75-85°F Sow outside in the fall OR skip cold stratification and after last frost, soak in tepid water 2-3 days, changing water daily until radicle emerges, then sow with very light cover. A. incarnata transplants easily from root divisions.
