

Bouteloua gracilis

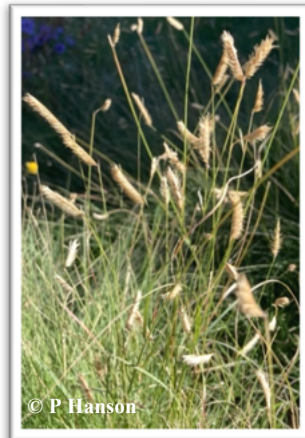
Blue Grama



Plant type: Perennial warm-season rhizomatous/clumping grass
Season of Interest: Late spring to late fall
Height: 1-2' **Spread:** 1-2'
Water needs: Low
Native Region: CO, AZ, KS, NE, NM, OK, TX, UT, WY
Elevation: to 10,000'
Important to know: Freely seeds, but easily managed



Maintenance: Low
Characteristics: Showy
Garden Uses: Beds/borders, ground cover
Habitat: prairie, meadow, stream banks, ditches, roadsides



Ease of Propagation: Medium

Propagation: Store dry at 40°F (dry cold stratification; prairie moon.com). Sow mid-April to mid-May in situ or in cells. Cover lightly. Germination seems lower than in some of the other warm season grasses; be generous when sowing the seeds.
