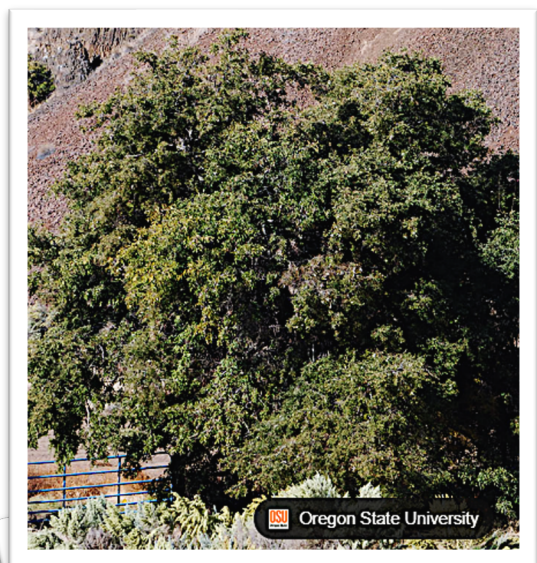


Celtis reticulata

Western/Netleaf Hackberry



Plant type: Perennial
Height: 15-30' **Spread:** 10-25'
Water needs: Low
Native Region: CO, KS, NM, OK, TX, UT, WY
Elevation: 3,500'-6,600'



Maintenance: Low
Characteristics: Often confused with American Elm. Flowers are unisexual and inconspicuous.
Garden Uses: Shade Tree
Habitat: Rocky Slopes, Canyons
Good to Know: Susceptible to nipple gall but isn't negatively affected by it.



Ease of Propagation: Easy

Propagation: Soak and ferment the berries to remove the fruit from the seeds. Cold stratify the seeds in the fridge or outside for 120 days. They can be sown in cells or in situ.
