Characteristics: Evergreen. Feathery spiral styles on

seeds make this a showy fall shrub.

Garden Uses: Banks/slopes, hedges

Habitat: Foothills, shrublands, open woods,

dry slopes





Propagation: Deplume the seeds and store dry at 40°F. Soak the seeds in water for 30 minutes. Cold stratify for 1 month. Sow at 70°F and cover the seeds lightly. First leaves appear 17 days after sowing. Seeds could probably be soaked, sown and covered lightly in situ about a month before the last frost date.
