
Eriocoma hymenoides

Indian Ricegrass



Plant type: Perennial cool-season bunchgrass

Season of Interest: Summer

Height: up to 2' **Spread:** 1-1.5'

Water needs: Low

Native Region: CO, AZ, KS, NE, NM, OK, TX, UT, WY

Elevation: up to 10,000'

Important to know: Synonym *Achnatherum hymenoides*.

Larval host to skippers. Can be mown to

8" in early fall. Don't plant with

aggressive plants.



Maintenance: Low

Characteristics: Showy texture when it goes to seed **Random Fact:** Reproduces only by seed. Seeds were

important food source for Native Americans -

much like rice is used.

Garden uses: Beds & borders; restoration

Habitat: Plains, mesas, dry slopes, grasslands and

pinyon-juniper woodlands







Propagation: Cold stratification required as hard seed cover prolongs dormancy. Scarify seeds mechanically with sandpaper and then cold moist stratify at 40°F by sowing outdoors in the fall (in cells or situ). *Seeds require 6-10 months of cold stratification to germinate.* [NRCS.USDA.gov]
