Ease of Propagation:

Propagation: Sow after-ripened, dry, freshly

collected seeds before they become dormant under light cover in situ or in cells in fall. If storing, after-ripen seeds at 70°F then store seeds dry at 40F. Unlike other buckwheats, no cold moist stratification necessary per Susan E Meyer and Alisa Paulsen as well as Penn Parmenter. Sow seeds in spring (after last frost) or early summer in a well-drained soil. [PFAF.org]
