
Eriogonum jamesii

James' Buckwheat, Antelope Sage



Season of Interest: Mid-summer to early fall

Height: 10-15" **Spread:** 12-24"

Water needs: Low, xeric

Native Region: CO, AZ, KS, NM, OK, TX, UT

Elevation: to 1,000'

Important to know: Cream flowers turn dark pink at end of

bloom season in the fall and then dry a

deep rust.



Habitat: Semi-desert, foothills, montane, plains, rocky/shale

slopes, Pinyon-Juniper





Ease of Propagation: Difficult

Propagation: Store seeds at 40°F. The radicle of buckwheat seeds is in the pointed tip and can be damaged by aggressive rubbing on a screen, rendering seed unviable. Rigorous cleaning is not necessary as the seeds can germinate with

the tepals attached. Dec. to Jan. 1, sow seeds outside (in situ or in cells), cover with about 1/16" of fine vermiculite. Germination: may occur anywhere between 40°F and 70°F.
