Propagation: Clean and dry seeds asap after harvest; put in freezer for 2 weeks to treat for weevils. Store seeds dry at 40°F. Sow seeds in mid Dec. and put outside for the winter OR cold stratify at 40°F for 2 months, then sow, covering the seeds lightly. Outdoor sowing with some native soil (and temperature fluctuations) seems to result in better germination percentages.
