## **Common Hop**



Plant type: Perennial climber
Season of Interest: April - August

**Height:** Stems up to 20' long

Water needs: Low

Native Region: CO, NE, NM, TX, UT, WY

**Elevation:** 4,800-8,500'

**Important to know:** Dioecious (male and female plants)

vine. Very important larval host for the rare, hops-feeding Azure butterfly,

susceptible to Japanese beetles







Maintenance: Medium

Characteristics: plants have relatively more

"branching" than traditional hops which creates more cones than some

other hops strains

**Garden uses:** Screens

**Habitat:** Grows on trees and shrubs in cool,

moist, shaded canyons, rocky outcrops





## **Ease of Propagation: Easy**

**Propagation:** Cold stratify in the fridge or outside for at least 3 months. After sowing the seeds, cover them well (dark requirement). Germinate in 2.5-3.5 weeks at temperatures about 60° daytime and 35-45° nighttime.
