Ease of Propagation: Easy

Propagation: Blue Flax seeds germinate best when exposed to broad temperature fluctuations before consistently exposed to 70°F (spring weather). The easiest way to provide temperature swings is to sow the seeds in early winter either in cells/pots or in situ. Cover lightly. Pile snow on the cells regularly during the winter or water during dry spells. Germinates ~1 week after the last frost date.
