## White Locoweed



**Plant type:** Perennial

## **Ease of Propagation: Easy**

**Propagation:** Store seeds dry at 40°F. When daytime temperatures hover consistently around 70°F or after the last frost date, scarify seeds with sandpaper. Inoculate with rhizobium inoculant (optional) and sow promptly. Cover to depth. Seeds germinate in 3 days to 2 months. Germination is easy; maintenance in pots is difficult (high mortality rate). Use a well-draining medium. It may be best to transplant small plants into the ground as soon as possible.
