## Ease of Propagation: Easy

**Propagation:** By soft-wood cuttings or seed. Cold stratify the seeds 8 weeks at 40° in the fridge or sow midwinter in situ or in containers. Cover the seeds lightly. Put the container outside. Outside treatment in cells requires regular piling on of snow but avoids radicle extension from the seeds while in the fridge. Seeds germinate 3-9 days once temps reach 70°F.
