Grey-Headed Coneflower



Plant type:	Perennial
Season of Interest:	Mid to late summer
Height: 2-5'	Spread: 18-36"
Water needs:	Moderate, low
Native Region:	KS, NE, OK
Elevation:	to 5,800'
Important to know:	Long blooming, great source of seeds for birds during the winter



Maintenance:	Low
Characteristics:	Cut flowers, showy
Garden uses:	Beds/borders, banks/slopes
Habitat:	Prairie, dry woods, railroad tracks, roadsides

Ease of Propagation: Easy

Propagation: Cold stratify for 30 days. Sow seeds to depth outside in fall or early spring. ~ 1 week to germination if cold stratified indoors and sown at 70°F (rngr.net)
