

Solidago mollis

Soft Goldenrod, Velvety Goldenrod



Plant type:	Rhizomatous Perennial
Season of Interest:	Summer to early fall
Height: up to 2'	Spread: 1-2'
Water needs:	Low
Native Region:	CO, KS, NE, NM, OK, TX, WY
Elevation:	up to 7,000'
Important to know:	Cylindrical to pyramidal flowers. Grey-green foliage. Form many stemmed clones; colony-forming



Maintenance:	Low
Characteristics:	Forms many stemmed clones; colony-forming
Garden uses:	Butterfly gardens, borders, prairie restoration. Not as aggressively spreading as other Solidagos.
Habitat:	Sandy or rocky soil of the plains and outer foothills.



Ease of Propagation: Easy

Propagation: By cutting, division or seed.

By seed -- cold stratify for 3 months at 40°F with light cover (seeds require light to germinate.) Suitable for wintersowing. [The National Gardening Association Plant Database]
