Propagation: Cleaning is a challenge. Enveloping the loments completely in a tarp (to contain runaway seeds) and stomping with heavy soled boots would work. Sandpapering with coarse sandpaper, then crushing with a rolling pin and finally scraping around on a strong soil sieve wire works but is time consuming. Seeds can be stored dry for many years at 40-70°.

Before sowing, scarify the seeds with sandpaper and a boiling water soak. Inoculate (opt). Sow the seeds in deep cells or in situ either in late fall or in spring. Cover the seeds well.
