**Propagation:** "Yuccas will germinate promptly from fresh seed held over winter (in moist sand in the fridge). Seeds germinate best in 60-70 degree temperatures. Yuccas may also be grown from rhizomes, stem cuttings, or by digging offsets from the side of established plants. Transplant into a well-draining medium." [wildflower.org]
